# **Campus Procedures & Policies**

# **Volunteers & Visitors**

When visiting any ILCS campus, please remember to sign in and receive a badge at the school office using the Raptor® device. Please refer to each of the campus maps for the location of the offices.

# **Short-term Independent Study**

In the event of an extended absence for reasons of personal business, family vacation, or other such circumstances, a student must obtain an Independent Study application from the attendance office at least seventy-two (72) hours prior to the absence. All student work must be turned into the teacher. The length of absence must be between two days and three weeks to be eligible.

# **Traffic Laws**

Parents are expected to follow all traffic laws. Students must be picked up at exit locations only and are not permitted to be picked up from any other location on or off campus. Furthermore, in regards to safety and to lessen traffic congestion, parents are encouraged to pick up their children from the side of the street where students exit. If a parent chooses to park on the opposite side of the street, the parent must walk *entirely* across the street to receive their child from the dismissal area. Parents may not "wave" their children to cross the street by themselves or receive their child in the middle of the street. Parents also may not double park to pick up or drop off their child/ren. Please keep in mind, it's <u>illegal</u> to perform a u-turn on California St.

# **Pick-up Procedures**

To help keep a steady flow of traffic, pick up locations after school are based on grade levels.

- · 3<sup>rd</sup> grade pick-up is at **1:05** on Ave. D.
- · 4<sup>th</sup> grade pick-up is at **1:15** on California St.
- · 5<sup>th</sup> grade pick-up is at **1:15** on California St.
- · 6<sup>th</sup> grade pick-up is at **1:15** on Adams St.
- · 7<sup>th</sup> grade pick-up is at **1:45** on Adams St.
- · 8<sup>th</sup> grade pick-up is at **1:45** on Adams St.

To help keep a steady flow of traffic, pick up locations for <u>After School Programs</u> (Success Academy & Electives) are based on grade levels as well:

- $\cdot$  3<sup>rd</sup> grade pick-up is at **2:45** on Ave. D.
- · 4<sup>th</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> grade pick-up is at **2:45** on California St.
- · 6<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grade pick-up is at **2:45** on Adams St.


\*The pick up location immediately <u>after lunch</u> for **3rd-6th** grades is on California St. at **1:45**. At this time, 7th-8th grades exit to Adams St. Younger siblings of middle school students may exit to Adams St. as well for carpooling.

# **Drop-off Procedures**

Parents may drop students off <u>before school</u> at California Street <u>or</u> Adams Street locations between 7:30-8:00, regardless of grade level. Unless special arrangements are made between a parent and staff member, a student should never be dropped off at school before 7:30 AM as there is no supervision during that time. **The warning bell rings at 7:55, & classes begin at 8:00**. Ave. D is *not* open for drop off in the morning.

# <u>Carpool</u>

For siblings or any carpool pick-up, families may pick up <u>all</u> parties at the location of the student in the <u>highest</u> grade. For example, a 3<sup>rd</sup> grader <u>may</u> exit with a 5<sup>th</sup> grade sibling at California St. A 5<sup>th</sup> grader <u>may not</u> exit on Ave. D with a 3<sup>rd</sup> grade sibling.

# Emergency Release Procedures: California St. Campus

In the event of an emergency, ILCS families will be notified of the event details & its impact at the campus location via *Parent Square*. If the incident follows with the evacuation of students, please understand & follow the following protocols to ensure the most efficient release of students to parents or guardians.

- 1. Have Emergency Release cards updated regularly. Students <u>will not</u> be released to adults who are not given release authority as indicated on the emergency cards.
- 2. Follow the instructions given by staff. All staff are assigned & trained in various roles in the event of an emergency.
- 3. Parents must make a request for their student, in person with the Student Request team located at the corner of Ave. D & Adams St.
- 4. After receiving clearance, parents proceed to the center gate located on Adams Street, near the "ball wall," where the Student Release Team will release your student to you.
- 5. In the event that danger is present on the field, the location will be changed & posted through *Parent Square*.
- Online communications may not be reliable in catastrophic events. Look
  for large signs posted around campus for directions regarding student pickup locations.

# **Programs & Expectations**

# **Dress Code (Dress for Success)**

- Collared shirts and/or ILCS blue lion logo shirts are required and they must fully
  cover the torso from the waist to a point no lower than two inches from the
  collarbone; shirts must also cover the top of the shoulder. If the shirt has
  buttons, the buttons must be fastened to a point no lower than two inches from
  the collarbone.
- 2. Dresses and rompers must cover the entire torso including the back and the top of the shoulder with a scoop line that reaches a point no lower than two inches beneath the collarbone. Hemlines must not extend more than three inches above the knee.
- 3. All pants/skirts/shorts must fall at, or above, the student's natural waistline.
- 4. All clothing, including jackets, must be free of text & graphic (pictures/drawings) prints. Small branding logos (no larger than a credit card) such as Polo, Lacoste, Nike, etc. are acceptable. Patterns such as stripes and plaids are acceptable.
- 5. Hats are **not** to be worn indoors but may have appropriate text or logos. Hats must be worn forward and not turned sideways or backwards.
- 6. Shoes must be in good repair and have a heel strap.
- All clothing should be in good repair without rips, tears, holes, or fraying (either intentional or unintentional).
- 8. Students may wear ILCS tee shirts and sweatshirts. On Fridays, students may wear tee-shirts and sweatshirts supporting ILCS electives/events and tee shirts and sweatshirts that represent colleges/universities or military. These shirts and sweatshirts should be free of inappropriate graphics.
- 9. With the exception of shorts, all hemlines must be no higher than three inches above the knee. Hemlines for shorts must be no higher than five inches from the knee.
- 10. Athletic wear and leisurewear is not acceptable. This includes, but is not limited to athletic shorts or pants, yoga pants, leggings worn as pants, tee shirts, pajama pants except on school sponsored dress up days. Undergarments must never be visible.
- 11. Attire including jewelry/accessories such as piercings that present a safety hazard or distraction to the educational environment are not permissible.
- 12. ILCS-sports team shirts & outerwear can be worn each day. Outerwear includes jackets, hoodie/crewneck sweatshirts, and sweaters. Crewneck sweatshirts and sweaters must have a neckline that reaches a point no lower than two inches from the collarbone.

Student consequences for violations will be subject to progressive discipline as determined in the schoolwide discipline plan and initiatives.

Chronic violation of the policy constitutes a violation of the ILCS / Parent Contract and may result in further action by the ILCS Board.

School administration is provided the discretion to determine if certain attire meets the dress code that is not specifically listed in the policy above.

# Success Academy & English Support (Intervention)

Kindergarten through 6<sup>th</sup> grade teachers will be offering *Success Academy* sessions for students who need additional support in academics. *Success Academy* is an ILCS intervention offering. Placement in *Success Academy* is up to each teacher's discretion, & when requested, attendance in the program is required. At CSC, *Success Academy* occurs on Wednesday, Thursday, or both days from 1:45-2:45.

Success Academy's Session A begins on Aug. 30, & ends Dec. 8. There are <u>no</u> After School Programs from Nov. 10 - 24. Session B runs from Jan 16 - May 17, with a break from March 18 - April 8.

7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> grade students may be rostered to *English Support* which is an embedded intervention that takes the place of Spanish & Technology on Tuesdays and Thursdays during the school day. After school support for middle school students is available to <u>all</u> 7th-8th graders and is optional. See "Office hours" on each teacher's syllabus to see offered days & times.

If a student is scheduled for *Success Academy* or *English Support*, this placement can be seen in the *Aeries* portal after attendance has been "initialized."

# **Electives**

ILCS is proud to offer Kindergarten – 8<sup>th</sup> grade electives for our students. Electives are offered in two Sessions: A & B. With each "session," parents can sign their child(ren) up for a new set of elective options. Session A begins on Aug. 30, & ends Dec. 8. There are <u>no</u> After School Programs from Nov. 10 - 24. Session B runs from Jan 16 - May 17, with a break from March 18 - April 8.

Parents sign their child(ren) up for electives through an online survey emailed to families several weeks prior to the beginning of electives. Elective class rosters are emailed at least one week prior to the start date of **August 28**.

# **Educational Services**

Special Education is a set of services designed to support students with disabilities in accessing their learning. Special Education is regulated at both state and federal levels. Inland Leaders employs a variety of individuals with different specialties, including specialized academic instruction, speech and language, mental health services, occupational therapy, along with many other areas.

At different times in childhood and adolescence, life can bring challenges that require additional support, particularly emotional support. Inland Leaders Charter School has a school counselor available for students presenting with emotional challenges that are impacting their learning. Additionally, ILCS provides support in assisting in screening for wellbeing and continued care. If

# **ROAR to Success**

In 2016, a team of teachers, parents, & administration created *ROAR to Success*. ROAR highlights the expectations ILCS holds for all students.

Respect others, self, & property
Own your actions
Act Safely
Rise to Servant-Leadership

The ILCS staff celebrates as students exhibit the leader-like behavior outlined in ROAR. Students who fail to meet expectations are encouraged & provided support so that they may grow towards the expectation of all students. Encouragement & support is provided through data-driven interventions & consequences.

In 2019-20, CSC saw a **new** phase of ROAR, through the implementation of *Houses*. Students in 3rd-8th will strive to work for a safe, encouraging, & fun campus through recognizing the good in every student. Students are given House shirts which **are to be worn every Monday.** *Houses* will receive points (awards) for their participation in wearing provided shirts, demonstrating positive behavior, and participating/competing in House tournaments.

# **Athletic Handbook**

The following changes have been added to the *Athletic Handbook* for middle school sports:

# Attendance:

- 1. Students with an annual attendance rate below 94% present cannot participate in ILCS Sports' Teams.
- 2. Students who miss any part of a period (tardies/early release) on a game day, *prior to the all-call for athlete's dismissal*, may not play in that day's game/meet.
- 3. Students who miss any full period on a practice/training day may not participate in practice/training on that day.

# **Grades:**

- 1. 7th & 8th graders with a GPA below 2.5 cannot participate in ILCS Sports' Teams.
- 2. Any athlete with a sum of 5 or more missing assignments cannot participate in practices or games until the missing assignments, reflected on *Aeries*, are below 5.
